

Funny Women Awards: Grand Final Line-Up Announced

10 exciting new acts 5 celebrity mentors

<u>Duchess Theatre, London</u> Monday 12 March, 2018 at 7.30pm

Now in their fifteenth year, the **Funny Women Awards** have announced the finalists for the **Stage Award**, joining those already announced for the <u>Comedy Writing</u>

<u>Award</u> and <u>Comedy Shorts Award</u> for which you can view the entries <u>here</u>.

The awards received a record number of registrations this year - the Stage Award, alone, received over 400 entries and in total nearly 1,000 registrations and nominations for acts and shows were considered.

Previous Stage Award winners and finalists have included **Katherine Ryan**, **Zoe Lyons**, **Jayde Adams**, **Desiree Burch**, **Harriet Braine**, **Sara Pascoe**, **Sarah Millican** and **Susan Calman**.

In advance of the charity final on March 12 at The Duchess Theatre in London, hosted by Jan Ravens (Dead Ringers, Spitting Image), Funny Women have announced five celebrity mentors who will help the 10 Stage Award finalists hone their acts in the run up to the event. The mentors are: Gemma Whelan (Game of Thrones), Sindhu Vee (As Yet Untitled), Phil Nichol (Never Mind The Buzzcocks), Patrick Monahan (Celebrity Squares, The One Show Edinburgh Festival) and Arnab Chanda (Russell Howard's Good News, Hunderby), The mix of male and female comedians was decided upon to reflect the

HeForShe solidarity movement pioneered by the awards' charity sponsor, **UN Women National Committee UK.**

Funny Women founder, Lynne Parker said:

"We have received a record number of entries this year across all four categories (Stage Award, Comedy Shorts, Comedy Writing Award and Best Show Award) and I personally saw over 400 women compete in live heats for the coveted Stage Award all over the UK."

"Women have such a strong and important voice in the comedy industry and so many of today's big names have taken part in the awards at the beginning of their careers. I am excited to see who comes next!"

As identity cards and 'Cool Britannia' were being introduced, Monahan found himself on the periphery as a teenager - trying to blend in but ending up with all the other ethnic groups!

British actress and comedian Gemma Whelan is known for her varied body of work. Gemma was last seen in critically acclaimed dark comedy *The End of the F***ing World* on Channel 4 and Netflix opposite Alex Lawther and Jessica Barden. Last year Gemma reprised the role of Yara Greyjoy in series seven of *Game of Thrones* on HBO in the US and Sky Atlantic in the UK. In 2016 Gemma was nominated for a Screen Actors Guild Award (SAG) with her fellow *Game of Thrones* cast members, for 'Outstanding Performance by an Ensemble in a Drama Series'. As a comedian Gemma created and often performs as character Chastity Butterworth. Gemma brought the character to series three of Live at the Electric for BBC 3 and in 2014 recorded a pilot chat show for BBC Radio 4 called The Chastity Butterworth Show. This was followed up by an episode of the comedy chat show on BBC Radio 4 in 2017. In 2010 Gemma won a Funny Women Variety Award for her stand up comedy.
